From The Director

BUILDING UPDATE:



So far in 2023, we have patched the roof, repaired broken sidewalks, filled potholes and repaired areas of the parking lot. Despite patching the roof and cleaning the gutters, we still experience leaks that result in crumbling and falling ceiling tiles and damaged books.

As I mentioned earlier this year, although our Master Renovation Plan for the building cannot yet proceed because critical funding has not been secured, Library Administrators have set a goal for 2023 to begin some of the most critical work in ensuring we can maintain Library operations. Although the Library needs a



complete rewiring of its electrical systems, for this year plans are moving forward to install a building-wide generator and surge protector. This is needed due to the repeated, extended power outages the Library has experienced over the past several years. This project has been publicly bid and awarded to Rockland Electric. Plans are also moving forward with installation of a digital outdoor message board to replace the existing sign which is cumbersome to change, and limited in its usefulness. We are excited to bring in an LCD screen for more effective postings about all of the events and programs that happen in our bustling building every day.

Additional projects planned for the coming months include a new fire alarm panel and smoke detectors, and a new bottle-filler style drinking fountain.

We continually strive to better utilize our space and fulfill the constant demand for meeting rooms and



study spaces, but there is not much we can do to create the kinds of spaces our patrons ask for without renovating the building. That said,

we are mindful of patron concerns about the cost of such a project. We are hard at work revising the Master Renovation Plan, taking into account all that we now know about our taxpayers' concerns and needs. Keep an eye on future newsletters and mailings for updates.
